<b>Objective:</b> The objective of the course is to introduce students to basic characteristics, concepts and institutes of international public law, social processes and laws that govern the international community and legal technique that forms a specific normative order and regulates relations between states and international organizations and other entities - individuals of international interest.			
<b>The outcome of the subject</b> After passing the exam, the student adopted the theoretical knowledge necessary for proper interpretation and application of the norms of international public law; trained for the initial level of practical operation in the field of interaction communication of subjects of international relations and application of acquired theoretical knowledge in the field of rationalization and logical application of norms and procedures contained in international judicial instruments and international judicial bodies.

The ratio of domestic and international law. 5. Formal sources of international law. 6. Submissions of international law. 7. Country. Recognition of states and governments. Basic rights and obligations of states. 8. State jurisdiction in international law. State responsibility. 9. Organi for maintaining international relations. Multilateral diplomacy. 10. State Succession. Boundaries in international law. 11. The manner of acquisition and loss of state territory. 12. International service. International rivers. Maritime area. Airspace. Polar authorities. Cosmic space. 13. The rules of international contract law. 14. International organizations. United Nations. 15. International Court of Justice. <b>Practical classes:</b> Clarify clarification of some of the topics addressed in lectures, with a special emphasis on the interpretation of key legal concepts and the institute of international public law. Case studies. Discussion of selected topics with the active participation of students. Preparation of colloquium and exams. Evaluation of realized teaching and analysis of its results.
